## What translation should I use?

A part of the reason why there are so many different translations is because many different individuals and translation committees have tried to interpret the oldest manuscripts of the Bible that we have. These manuscripts are mostly in Hebrew and Greek. So work needs to be done to interpret these ancient writings into modern English. Some use a word-for-word technique, and others try a thought-for-thought technique. Most of them are simply trying to help communicate, as best they can, what they feel the original authors were trying to convey.
